HOW DO SCHOOL AND DISTRICT LEADERS ENSURE ACADEMIC INTEGRITY AS NEW AI TECHNOLOGIES EMERGE?

1.) Train Your Staff and Families

Equip your staff and families with the necessary skills for leveraging artificial intelligence (AI) tools effectively. I suggest offering training sessions and resources to teachers, support staff, students, and parents. Here are free resources to get you started:

2.) Strengthen Trust with Students Through Individual Discussions

While there are tools that can help identify potential cheating, they're not foolproof. Educators play a crucial role in discerning the authenticity of student work. By having regular one-to-one interactions with students, teachers can get better insight into their interests, strengths, and challenges, which can aid in evaluating the legitimacy of their work. This personalized approach can also help distinguish between students leveraging Al tools for learning versus cheating.

For example, one of our teachers recently noticed that their student had a high AI detection score on an assignment. To understand why the AI score was so high, the teacher had a one-to-one conversation with the student where she learned that the student used ChatGPT to deepen their understanding of the topic. This dialogue highlights that AI use isn't inherently negative. Instead, it enhanced the student's comprehension and fostered teacher-student collaboration on how to best use AI tools.



3.) Encourage Creative Use of Al Tools Among Teachers and Support Staff

Consider the evolution of calculators, once feared for promoting shortcuts in math education but now indispensable aids that enhance comprehension and efficiency. Similarly, Al tools offer educators the opportunity to innovate teaching methods.

Encourage brainstorming sessions among your teachers and support staff on how they can creatively use AI tools in the classroom (in-person or virtual). Here are a few ideas:

- Utilize AI to reinforce students' writing skills, such as grammar and essay structures.
- Challenge students to analyze Al-generated content to identify key elements like thesis statements and supporting evidence.
- Integrate AI into educational games and quizzes aligned with the curriculum.
